## 17.3.15 Publication of SDG reports - SDG 15: Life on Land

Universitas Sriwijaya possesses a total land area of 7,241,059 square meters, including a natural forest region covering 2,285,020 square meters, which accounts for approximately 32% of UNSRI's overall land area. Furthermore, there is a planted area of 1,405.31 square meters that consists of fruit trees and other plants. The natural forest area also includes a 5-hectare arboretum, which was established in 2007 with initial funding from the South Sumatra Forest Fire Management Project (SSFFMP), a collaborative initiative supported by the European Commission and the Indonesian government through the Ministry of Forestry (MoF).

Within the planted area, there is a section known as Taman Firdaus, a 120-hectare garden within the campus in Indralaya, Ogan Ilir District. This garden serves multiple functions, including recreation, research, and functioning as a field laboratory. The development of this park is a result of a collaborative effort involving various parties. The campus also has a facility of clean water supply with capacity. Due to the high demand of clean water in the future, UNSRI has planned an upgrade for its clean water facility in 2023
